## Creative Movement

Creative Movement was all about Transportation in January. Transportation on the road was a lot of fun with several songs, including The Wheels on the Bus, and another favorite, Driving in My Car. We used Hula Hoops for steering wheels, and played a game similar to the classic, Red Light Green Light. We also had a fun game of 'bus stop'.
For Water transportation, we had a blast rowing our boats across the river. We did this using carpet squares on tile floors. Air transportation was fun using our flying imaginations with Helicopters, Jets, and blasting to space in our Spaceships. We had a couple of movement songs of flying to add to the fun.
Our last week was all about transportation on tracks. The children loved the train obstacle we used for this. We concluded our month with everyone receiving a "driver's license."
February in Movement will be all about body parts. We will have a lot of partner games as well. The children are already learning some names of muscles and the importance of staying fit. - Mrs. Duncan

## Music

I am so proud of all our children for singing so well for the Christmas Program. Didn't they do great? They learn so quickly.
In January, we started learning about music. We learned that every song has a beat or rhythm and how we can make all kinds of rhythm with our hands and feet. For example, clapping, patting, walking, running, etc. We also learned about fast and slow rhythm by pretending to be a slow, fat cat and a scurrying mouse. Along with that we sang songs about snowmen and dinosaurs. Their favorite was "Once There Was a Snowman". Ask your child to sing it for you.
In February, we will start the month driving and flying cars, planes, trucks and trains during our transportation week! Later in the month we will sing songs about families, Valentine's Day and explore high and low sounds in both nature and music. - Mrs. Andrus
