

The Lessons

FIRST READING: Exodus 17:1-7

The people sit.

A Reading from the book of Exodus.

¹From the wilderness of Sin the whole congregation of the Israelites journeyed by stages, as the LORD commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. ²The people quarreled with Moses, and said, "Give us water to drink." Moses said to them, "Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the LORD?" ³But the people thirsted there for water; and the people complained against Moses and said, "Why did you bring us out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and livestock with thirst?" ⁴So Moses cried out to the LORD, "What shall I do with this people? They are almost ready to stone me." ⁵The LORD said to Moses, "Go on ahead of the people, and take some of the elders of Israel with you; take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. ⁶I will be standing there in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it, so that the people may drink." Moses did so, in the sight of the elders of Israel. ⁷He called the place Massah and Meribah, because the Israelites quarreled and tested the LORD, saying, "Is the LORD among us or not?"

PSALM: Psalm 78:1-4, 12-16

Remain seated.

¹Hear my teaching, O my people; * incline your ears to the words of my mouth. ²I will open my mouth in a parable; * I will declare the mysteries of ancient times. ³That which we have heard and known, and what our forefathers have told us, * we will not hide from their children. ⁴We will recount to generations to come the praiseworthy deeds and the power of the LORD, * and the wonderful works he has done. ¹²He worked marvels in the sight of their forefathers, * in the land of Egypt, in the field of Zoan. ¹³He split open the sea and let them pass through; * he made the waters stand up like walls. ¹⁴He led them with a cloud by day, * and all the night through with a glow of fire. ¹⁵He split the hard rocks in the wilderness * and gave them drink as from the great deep. ¹⁶He brought streams out of the cliff, * and the waters gushed out like rivers.

SECOND READING: Philippians 2:1-13

A Reading from Paul's letter to the Church in Philippi.

¹If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, ²make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. ³Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. ⁴Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. ⁵Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus,


⁶who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited,
⁷but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness.
And being found in human form, ⁸he humbled himself
and became obedient to the point of death even death on a cross.
⁹Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name,
¹⁰so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth,
¹¹and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

¹²Therefore, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed me, not only in my presence, but much more now in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; ¹³for it is God who is at work in you, enabling you both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

GOSPEL: Matthew 21:23-32

DeaconThe Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.PeopleGlory to you, Lord Christ.

²³When [Jesus] entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him as he was teaching, and said, "By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?" ²⁴Jesus said to them, "I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things. ²⁵Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?" And they argued with one another, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say to us, 'Why then did you not believe him?' ²⁶But if we say, 'Of human origin,' we are afraid of the crowd; for all regard John as a prophet." ²⁷So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And he said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things.

²⁸"What do you think? A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.' ²⁹He answered, 'I will not'; but later he changed his mind and went. ³⁰The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, 'I go, sir'; but he did not go. ³¹Which of the two did the will of his father?" They said, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Truly I tell you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you. ³²For John came to you in the way of righteousness and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes believed him; and even after you saw it, you did not change your minds and believe him."

THE SERMON

THE CREED (BCP p. 358) *All stand.*

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead. and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Joining our prayers to blessed Mary the Mother of God and all the saints, let us pray to the Lord, aloud or in the silence of our hearts.

Let us pray for the world: that we may repent of our loyalties to lesser powers and kneel with peoples gathered from every tribe and tongue and language and nation to declare Jesus is Lord over all. Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

Let us pray for our nation: for the President, the Congress, and the courts, that they may be honest and vigilant in their duties and their hearts may be converted toward working for justice and the common good. Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

Let us pray for our communities: that we may receive God's grace to move from grumbling to shared responsibility, from accusation to a search for truth, from humiliation and shame to God's compassion and mercy. Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

Let us pray for this parish: that our joy may be complete in finding the courage to be of the same mind that is in Christ Jesus, humbly setting ourselves aside to tend to the needs of one another and of those beyond our walls. Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

Let us offer thanksgiving for all the blessings of this life, especially for Catherine Campbell's healing and Maggie Graham's baptism. Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

Let us pray for those who celebrate birthdays this week, especially Benjamin Gajdalo, Deborah Anthony, CB Maertens, Wyatt Murphy and Genevieve Bishop. Watch over your children, O Lord, as their days increase; bless and guide them wherever they may be. Strengthen them when they stand; comfort them when discouraged or sorrowful; raise them up if they fall; and in their hearts may your peace which passes understanding abide all the days of their lives.

Let us pray for those who have died, especially Jack Lail, Melissa Kean, Carolyn Callicutt, and Gary Knivila., that they may continue to increase in knowledge and love of you and go from strength to strength. Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

The Officiant adds this concluding prayer:

Look with pity, O heavenly Father, upon the people in this land who live with injustice, terror, disease, and death as their constant companions. Have mercy upon us. Help us to eliminate our cruelty to these our neighbors. Strengthen those who spend their lives establishing equal

protection of the law and equal opportunities for all. And grant that every one of us may enjoy a fair portion of the riches of this land; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

CONFESSION OF SIN (BCP p. 359)

The Deacon says

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Silence may be kept.

Minister and People

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Celebrant Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. *Amen*.

THE PEACE (BCP p. 360)

Celebrant	The peace of the Lord be always with you.

The Holy Communion

The people remain standing as the Deacon prepares the altar.

Celebrant	The Lord be with you.

The Celebrant give thanks to God the Father and concludes

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The Celebrant continues, praising God for the salvation of the world through Jesus Christ and recalling the events of the Last Supper.

Celebrant	Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:
People	Christ has died.
-	Christ is risen.
	Christ will come again.

The Celebrant then invokes the Holy Spirit over the bread and wine and the assembly, praying that all may receive the benefits of Christ's work and the renewal of the Holy Spirit, concluding

Celebrant	by him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

Celebrant	And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

The consecrated Bread is broken and a period of silence follows.




