THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Throughout the service, the People make the responses in **bold print**.

Celebrant+Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.PeopleAnd blessed be his kingdom, now and for ever. Amen.The Celebrant says the Collect for Purity and the People respond Amen.

THE COLLECT	OF THE DAY
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Celebrant	The Lord be with you.
People	And also with you.
Celebrant	Let us pray.

Give us grace, O Lord, to answer readily the call of our Savior Jesus Christ and proclaim to all people the Good News of his salvation, that we and the whole world may perceive the glory of his marvelous works; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen**.

The People sit.

FIRST READING

JONAH 3:1-10

¹The word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time, saying, ²Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you. ³So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. ⁴Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, "Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" ⁵And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth.

⁶When the news reached the king of Nineveh, he rose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. ⁷Then he had a proclamation made in Nineveh: "By the decree of the king and his nobles: No human being or animal, no herd or flock, shall taste anything. They shall not feed, nor shall they drink water. ⁸Human beings and animals shall be covered with sackcloth, and they shall cry mightily to God. All shall turn from their evil ways and from the violence that is in their hands. ⁹Who knows? God may relent and change his mind; he may turn from his fierce anger, so that we do not perish."

¹⁰When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

¹⁶As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. ¹⁷And Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." ¹⁸And immediately they left their nets and followed him. ¹⁹As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. ²⁰Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

THE SERMON

MTR. SUZ CATE

After a moment of silence, the People stand.

THE NICENE CREED We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,

who proceeds from the Father and the Son.
With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.
He has spoken through the Prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

The Deacon calls the People to prayer, and the People make this response:

The Celebrant adds a concluding collect and the People respond Amen.

THE CONFESSION OF SIN AND THE PEACE

Deacon	Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

	and by what we have left undone.
	We have not loved you with our whole heart;
	we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.
	We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.
	For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
	have mercy on us and forgive us;
	that we may delight in your will,
	and walk in your ways,
	to the glory of your Name. Amen.
Celebrant	Almighty God have mercy on you, +forgive you all your

Celebrant Almighty God have mercy on you, +forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

CelebrantThe peace of the Lord be always with you.PeopleAnd also with you.

The People may exchange signs of greeting with one another and are then seated for announcements.

THE HOLY COMMUNION

After the Deacon prepares the Table, the People stand.

Celebrant	The Lord be with you.
People	And also with you.
Celebrant	Lift up your hearts.

People	We lift them to the Lord.
Celebrant	Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
People	It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The Celebrant give thanks to God the Father and concludes

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The Celebrant continues, praising God for the salvation of the world through Jesus Christ and recalling the events of the Last Supper.

Celebrant	Therefore, according to his command, O Father,
People	We remember his death,
-	We proclaim his resurrection,
	We await his coming in glory;
Celebrant	And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you

The Celebrant then invokes the Holy Spirit over the bread and wine and the assembly, praying that all may receive the benefits of Christ's work and the renewal of the Holy Spirit. At the following words, the People may make the sign of the cross over themselves:

Celebrant	+Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit.
The Great Th	panksgiving concludes
Celebrant	by him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.
People	AMEN.
Celebrant	And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,
People	Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
	Give us this day our daily bread.
	And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.
	And lead us not into temptation,
	but deliver us from evil.
	For thine is the kingdom,
	and the power, and the glory,
	forever and ever. Amen.

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

The consecrated Bread is broken and a period of silence follows.

Celebrant	Alleluia, Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.
People	Therefore let us keep the feast, alleluia.
Celebrant	The Gifts of God for the People of God.


All baptized Christians are invited to receive communion. Please remain in your area and communion will be brought to you. If you are not baptized or do not wish to receive, cross your arms over your chest, with fingers touching the opposite shoulder. If you wish to be baptized, please speak with one of the clergy after the service or contact the office.

For reasons of public health, we are distributing the Bread only; the Church teaches that the fullness of Christ's Body, Blood, Divinity, and Soul are fully present in either the Bread or the Wine alone. To receive the Bread, extend your arms fully with cupped hands and the priest will drop a wafer into your palm. Allow the priest to move to the next area before consuming. Replace your mask immediately.

During communion the following hymn is sung.
