THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

*Throughout the service, the People make the responses in **bold print**.*

Celebrant Alleluia. Christ is risen.
People **The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia.**

*The Celebrant says the Collect for Purity and the People respond **Amen**.*

THE COLLECT OF THE DAY

Celebrant The Lord be with you.
People **And also with you.**
Celebrant Let us pray.

O God, whose blessed Son made himself known to his disciples in the breaking of bread: Open the eyes of our faith, that we may

behold him in all his redeeming work; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

THE FIRST READING

ACTS 3:12-19

¹²Peter addressed the people, “You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk?¹³The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. ¹⁴But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you, ¹⁵and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. ¹⁶And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you.

¹⁷“And now, friends, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. ¹⁸In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah would suffer. ¹⁹Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out.”

PSALM 4

The psalm is said alternating between the Celebrant and the People, slowly and meditatively with a slight pause at each asterisk.

¹Answer me when I call, O God, defender of my cause; *
you set me free when I am hard-pressed;
have mercy on me and hear my prayer.

²**“You mortals, how long will you dishonor my
glory; *
how long will you worship dumb idols
and run after false gods?”**

³Know that the LORD does wonders for the
faithful; *
when I call upon the LORD, he will hear me.

⁴**Tremble, then, and do not sin; *
speak to your heart in silence upon your bed.**

⁵Offer the appointed sacrifices, *
and put your trust in the LORD.

⁶**Many are saying,
“Oh, that we might see better times!” *
Lift up the light of your countenance upon
us, O LORD.**

⁷You have put gladness in my heart, *
more than when grain and wine and oil increase.

⁸**I lie down in peace; at once I fall asleep; *
for only you, LORD, make me dwell in safety.**

THE EPISTLE

1 JOHN 3:1-7

¹See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. ²Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. ³And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

⁴Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. ⁵You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. ⁶No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. ⁷Little children, let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

THE HOLY GOSPEL

LUKE 24:36B-48

Priest The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according
to Luke.

People **Glory to you, Lord Christ**

^{36b}Jesus stood among the disciples and said to them, “Peace be with you.” ³⁷They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. ³⁸He said to them, “Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have.” ⁴⁰And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, “Have you anything here to eat?” ⁴²They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³and he took it and ate in their presence.

⁴⁴Then he said to them, “These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.” ⁴⁵Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, ⁴⁶and he said to them, “Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸You are witnesses of these things.”

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God,
 the Father, the Almighty,
 maker of heaven and earth,
 of all that is, seen and unseen.

 begotten, not made,

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver
of life,

who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshiped
and glorified.

He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic
Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the
forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

The Intercessor calls the People to prayer, and after each petition, the People make this response:

<i>Intercessor</i>	Answer us when we call, O Lord:
<i>People</i>	Have mercy on us and hear our prayer.

The Celebrant adds a concluding prayer.

Celebrant The peace of the Lord be always with
you.

People **And also with you.**

The People may exchange signs of greeting with one another and are then seated.

THE HOLY COMMUNION

*The Celebrant says a sentence of scripture and the Table is set. When all is ready,
the People stand.*

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER D

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People **And also with you.**

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People **We lift them to the Lord.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our
God.

People **It is right to give him thanks and
praise.**

*The Celebrant gives thanks to God the Father and concludes
...Joining with them, and giving voice to every creature under
heaven, we acclaim you, and glorify your Name, as we say,*

**Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.**

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

*The Celebrant continues, praising God for the salvation of the world through Jesus
Christ and recalling the events of the Last Supper.*

Celebrant ...offering to you, from the gifts you have given us,
this bread and this cup, we

praise you and we bless you.

People **We praise you,**

**we bless you,
we give thanks to you,
and we pray to you, Lord our God.**

The Celebrant then invokes the Holy Spirit over the bread and wine and the assembly, praying that all may receive the benefits of Christ's work and the renewal of the Holy Spirit. At the following words, the People may make the sign of the cross over themselves:

Celebrant +Grant that all who share this bread and cup may become one body and one spirit, a living sacrifice in Christ, to the praise of your Name.

The Great Thanksgiving concludes

Celebrant ...all honor and glory are yours, Almighty God and Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever.

People **AMEN.**

Celebrant And now as our Savior Christ hath taught us, we are bold to say

People **Our Father, who art in heaven,
 hallowed be thy Name,
 thy kingdom come,
 thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
 as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
 but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
 and the power, and the glory,
 forever and ever. Amen.**

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

The consecrated Bread is broken and a period of silence follows.

Celebrant Alleluia, Christ our Passover is

sacrificed for us.

People **Therefore let us keep the feast,
alleluia.**

Celebrant The Gifts of God for the People of God.

All baptized Christians are invited to receive communion. Please remain in your area and communion will be brought to you. If you are not baptized or do not wish to receive, cross your arms over your chest, with fingers touching the opposite shoulder. If you wish to be baptized, please speak with one of the clergy after the service or contact the office.

For reasons of public health, we are distributing the Bread only; the Church teaches that the fullness of Christ's Body, Blood, Divinity, and Soul are fully present in either the Bread or the Wine alone. To receive the Bread, extend your arms fully with cupped hands and the priest will drop a wafer into your palm. Allow the priest to move to the next area before consuming. Replace your mask immediately.

After Communion the Celebrant leads the People in this prayer

**Eternal God, heavenly Father,
you have graciously accepted us as living
members
of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ,
and you have fed us with spiritual food
in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood.
Send us now into the world in peace,
and grant us strength and courage
to love and serve you
with gladness and singleness of heart;
through Christ our Lord. Amen.**

The Celebrant blesses the People.

Celebrant Let us go forth in the name of Christ.
Alleluia, alleluia.

People **Thanks be to God. Alleluia, alleluia.**
