KEEPING THE FAITH: SUZ'S MONTHLY MESSAGE

Beloved in Christ,

Each week we gather to offer our “sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving” to our loving and life-giving God. Together we remember that our Lord, Jesus Christ, opened the door for us to eternal and abundant life in him. Rowan Williams, the former Archbishop of Canterbury, describes our Lord as the ultimate embodiment of welcome—welcoming everyone he encountered into the possibilities of new life. Our common worship is the regular opportunity to be welcomed by God, welcome each other, and welcome our neighbors.

The Holy Eucharist—literally Holy Thanksgiving—is the celebration of light in the darkest of places, grace washing away sin’s smudges on our souls, life overcoming death. By this bread and this wine, we are fed, nourished and strengthened for our work of hospitality in the world. This is the most important meal of all our days. And Holy Eucharist is the work of many hands, called and blessed for ministries of welcome.

Ushers present the most visible ministry of welcome, greeting friend and stranger as they come through the door, making sure that each person has what they need to participate fully in worshiping with us. **Lectors** and **Intercessors** (readers and prayer leaders) welcome us into hearing the Word of God to us in Holy Scripture and responding in prayer. **Acolytes** welcome us into seeing the life of servant leadership and is one of the ways that we invite young people into that life. **Eucharistic Ministers** welcome each person who comes to the altar rail, literally presenting Christ to us in the chalice. **Choirs** welcome us all into the joy of music and join our song to that of the heavenly host singing around God’s glory throne. The **Altar Guild**, often unnoticed despite the importance and necessity of their work, welcomes us with humble, quiet, unassuming devotion to preparing our space for worship and cleaning up afterwards. **Sunday School Teachers** and **Breakfast Teams** are two other vital ministries of welcome, bringing together the congregations that worship at 8:00 am and at 10:30 am each week. Sunday School Teachers, in particular, welcome our children, youth, and adults into life-long learning about God, themselves, and the Christian life.

We have proven to be quite adept at improvising and making do with fewer people involved in these ministries over the course of the pandemic years, but we really need more servants of welcome in each of these ministries to enrich our worship. The life that flows from the Holy Eucharist is richer and more joyful when more people are actively engaged in the *service* of welcome. None of these ministries is onerous, and all of them offer the opportunity to enter more deeply into the joy of God’s eternal kingdom as we enact it each Sunday. On page 4 of this *Tempo*, you will find a list of ministry leaders and their email addresses in each of these areas of welcome. Please consider contacting one or more of these leaders to discuss the possibility of enriching your life by participating in one of these ministries. Any one of them can change the way you worship and make it more meaningful.

WASHINGTON PARK DISTRUBTION

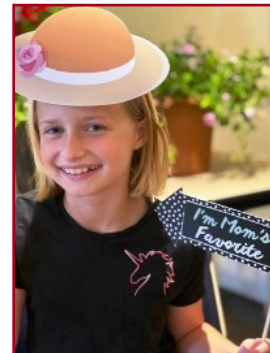
After assembly of the kits, everyone walked to Washington Park. Our students engaged with those in need. Everyone was so gracious. The kids really felt connected to the project.

EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY

Is God calling you to go deeper in your faith by loving God with your mind? Our group has met online via Zoom for the past two years and we anticipate that will continue, but a final decision on that will be made in late May.

FAMILY FUN FOR ALL!!

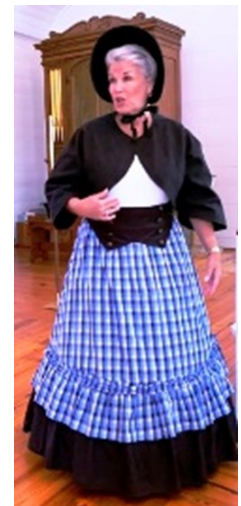

FORT HILL THROUGH THE EYES OF ANNA MARIA CLEMSON

Anna Maria Clemson lived from February 13, 1817 to September 22, 1875. She stated that the luxuries and splendors of Europe were nothing compared to her “dear old Fort Hill.” “She lived a model, Daughter, Wife, Mother and Friend. Her intelligence and accomplishments made her an ornament of every sphere in which she moved,” as stated on her tombstone in St. Paul’s Churchyard. The product of a famous family, this exceptional woman was very much a gracious southern lady. Her story and life’s journey gives us a glimpse of the importance of family in the midst of heartbreak, trials, temptations, and difficulties.

The above is from the talk presented by Sheri Belk who has many credentials in the SC school system and is currently teaching history at Clemson Classical Academy. Sheri talked at St. Paul’s in Pendleton on Thursday, April 28 from 11-12 noon and referenced the book by our own Dr. Ann Russell ([Anna Calhoun Clemson-Legacy of a Southern Lady](#)). The talk was a repeat of one Sheri gave in December and was very well attended.

UPDATE ON SHAW CENTER PROJECTS

Project Coordinator, Chesley Rowe, sent us an update on the Shaw Center projects. The two home owners, Mrs. White and Mrs. Walker, are so very grateful for the people who came out to improve their homes and for the support of Holy Trinity parishioners that made the work possible. Chesley's report follows:

With the help of some Phi Gamma Delta fraternity volunteers, we painted the window trim on Mrs. White's house. We hope to get the fraternity more involved in some Shaw Center projects in the future. Thanks to Noah for helping us to make the connection.

We completed the second house in April with the help of 6 volunteers and 53 volunteer hours in two days. Our focus on this house was levelling the kitchen floor and then installing new flooring in the kitchen and adjoining bathroom. Dan Farmer (husband of Lynne from the Holy Trinity Church office) lent his expertise in helping us remove the water heater, level the floor, and re-install the water heater. Dan helped us to have a really efficient first day on the house.

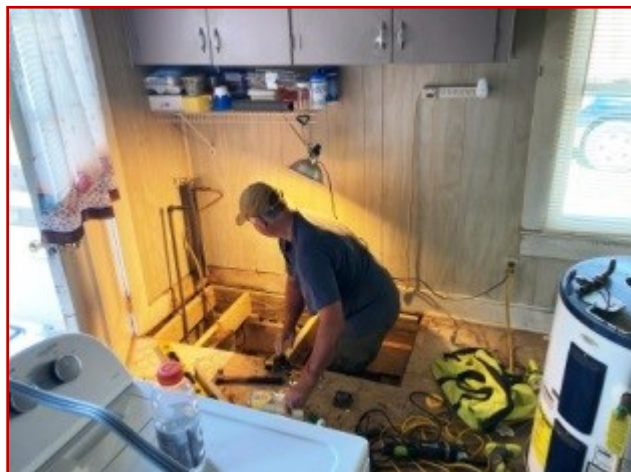
At the end of day 2, we had finished installing the new floor. AND what a difference a day makes!

Mrs. Walker (the homeowner) was really pleased with the new floor and how much it helped make her kitchen lighter and seem to be bigger! Before she left, she told us she was going over to her brother's house and get him to come see her new floor. I gotta admit, it doesn't hurt when you help someone. One of the steps in the bathroom floor replacement involved removing the toilet so the new floor could be installed under the floor. While the toilet was 'uninstalled' Mrs. Walker's 9 year old grandson came into the kitchen and observed the toilet on a pad in the kitchen. He slowly looked at the toilet, then into the bathroom, and then at me and said 'why is the toilet in the kitchen?'. I told him we had to remove the toilet in order to put in the new floor. He then asked me 'How did the toilet get here?' I gotta admit, it doesn't hurt looking at the world through the eyes of a 9 year old!!

We don't have a third house planned and after consulting with the Shaw Center organizers, it seems best if we take the summer off and plan to restart our home repair projects in the fall. I want to thank our volunteers (we had 21 different people participate) for their 173+ hours of volunteer work. I know that we made a difference. THANKS!!

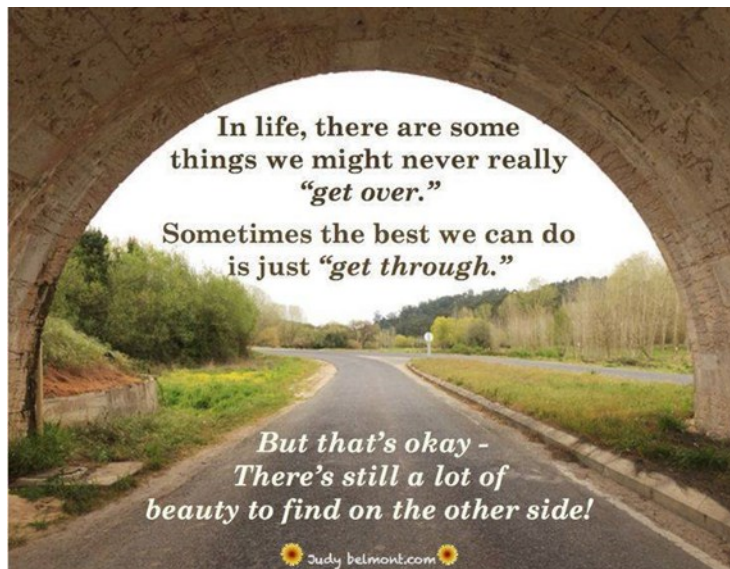
