Mothers and their children laughed and learned together in our parish hall so that they might flourish in their new home. We have committed significant resources to this mission to support the physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being of young people. This is good and holy work that we have been given to do!

God has blessed Holy Trinity with an incredibly dedicated Vestry. Not only do they attend monthly Zoom meetings, each one works constantly to keep Holy Trinity thriving. Here is a summary of the Vestry activities during the summer.

**Summer of Prayer.** This summer, the Vestry began praying daily at noon for Holy Trinity, our clergy, and our parish. We are praying for each of you. Two years of separation deepened divisions in our nation and even in our parish. A cycle of anger, protest and disconnecting has become the norm.

The Way of Christ's Love teaches us that through connecting, forgiving, and finding healing agreement we can redeem our relationships and our lives. Your Vestry prays each day for God's guidance to help us find our way to heal that which divides us so all may find redemption through Christ. Thanks be to God for the power of prayer.

**Church Finance.** The Vestry has worked with the Treasurer and Finance Committee to shepherd Holy Trinity finances during this transitional year. As of May, Holy Trinity has stayed on track with our 2022 Statement of Mission Operating Budget. Thanks to the generosity of our parishioners and the Vestry decision to make extra loan principal payments, the Trinity Place Demolition Loan can be repaid by the end of 2022. The single remaining Construction Loan service can be covered primarily with parking revenue. Thanks be to God for the blessing of our beautiful Trinity Place space and the generosity of our parish.

**Episcopal Day School (EDS) 2022-2023 Budget Approval.** Throughout the pandemic, the Vestry has worked with the EDS Board and Vestry liaison, John Warner, to keep the important mission of our Episcopal Day School going. Despite a brief closure and reduction in student numbers, EDS remains solvent and thriving. EDS applied for and received a significant DSS grant for the 2022-23 year. With the grant, the EDS budget expects to add \$136,559 to its fund balance this year. Thanks be to God for providing EDS the resources to continue its vital mission of quality Christian day care and education for pre-school children.

**Communications Infrastructure.** Following our Renewal Retreat in March, the Vestry began a micro strategy to assess and improve Holy Trinity's communication infrastructure. The two areas for development identified were an update to Holy Trinity's church website and an update to our nave hearing assistance technology. Thanks be to God for the work of our Communications Ministry.

**Mutual Ministry Review.** The Vestry has begun planning for our 2022 Mutual Ministry Review after a two-year break. The Mutual Ministry Review openly and honestly reviews what is happening at Holy Trinity. While it is not a process to complain, blame, or judge, the Mutual Ministry Review allows us to identify areas God is calling us to improve by "speaking the Truth with Love." We are working with the Diocese to identify a facilitator for the process. Thanks be to God for His wise guidance.

**Divine Purpose Workshop.** The Vestry will hold our "Divine Purpose Workshop" on 1 August from 5:00 to 6:30 PM. The Partnership for ReNewal team will lead us through introspection to understand God's "Divine Purpose" for Holy Trinity. We look forward to sharing what we learn.

## Coming up

**Regular Worship Schedule Resumes** We will return to our regular schedule on August 14: 8 am Rite I and 10:30 am Rite II with hymns. Choir returns to the 10:30 service on August 17, when we will also be welcoming Trey Williams, our new organist, to the bench.

**ACOLYTE TRAINING** To serve as an acolyte is to participate in a ministry of the Church that comes from ancient times. It is an honor to be selected as one who serves God and God's people at the altar. The Acolytes vest (put on robes), light the candles on the altar, lead the procession into the church at the beginning of the service, and assist the clergy in preparing the altar for communion. At the end of the service, acolytes lead the procession out of the church and extinguish the candles. Children (3rd grade and above) and adults are welcome to serve as acolytes. We will conduct an Acolyte training for anyone who is interested in serving in this special way—young, old, and in-between—at 9:30 on August 21 in the Nave. Coffee, juice, and donuts will be provided for those who attend the training.

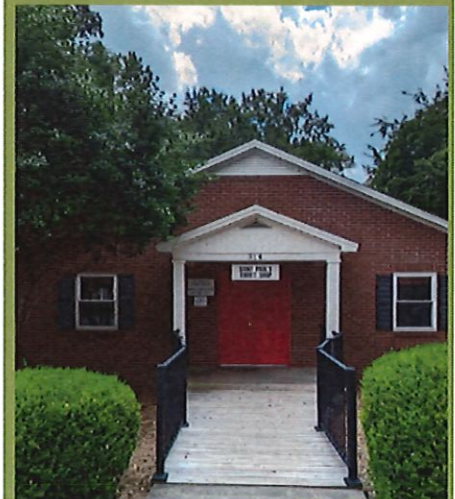

### Recommended Reading to Soothe the Soul:

*Extravagant Love: the Self-Emptying of Jesus* by Ruth Burrows, is a lovely book of rich reflections on the nature of Christ's love and how that love is woven into a life of prayer and meditation. Ruth Burrows is the pen name of Sister Rachel, a nun of the Carmelite monastery in Quidenham, England. These meditations were originally composed for the Sisters of Jesus in Nazareth, located in Zimbabwe. They are short meditations, but offer a fulsome picture of the self-emptying love of Jesus into which we are baptized and called to demonstrate in our lives. This little book is perfect for that first-cup-of-coffee time of prayer and reflection or for a contemplative break in a busy day.

## EPISCOPAL DAY SCHOOL

Our Episcopal Day School students will be returning in August. As they drive up Addison Lane to their drop-off point, they will be greeted by this wonderful new mural on the wall that supports their playground. The mural is a gift from generous parishioners who wanted to transform that wall as a tribute to honor the decades of ministry to the community that are the legacy of teachers, directors, board members, and parishioners providing a loving Christian learning environment for young children.

The mural was designed and painted by Sheldon Lynn, a local artist. The mural is designed to evoke an established structure in a natural environment, incorporating the iconic blue, yellow, and red birds representing the classes of the Episcopal Day School. I hope you will join me in thanking our generous donors for this exemplary public art project that the whole community can enjoy.

## PENDLETON FOUNDATION FOR BLACK HISTORY & CULTURE

I recently met the President of the Pendleton Foundation for Black History & Culture, Terence Hassan. When we spoke on the phone, Mr. Hassan told me that his great-great grandfather was the one who used to start the fire to heat St. Paul's on Sunday mornings and pump the organ. We found his great-great grandfather and great-great grandmother in the transcription of the St. Paul's register of Black Marriages. Mr. Hassan told me a touching story about the day his great-great grandmother learned she was free (which I have shared elsewhere) and observed that there are likely many others in the community who share that kind of connection with the names in our register. I believe this is a God-given opportunity for us to find new ways to collaborate with community members in Pendleton to tell a fuller story of the history of St. Paul's. For example, our churchyard will be included in a tour of graves of enslaved and formerly enslaved persons in October. We know that four Black persons were buried in the St. Paul's churchyard in the years following Emancipation, and two of them are listed elsewhere in our register as the property of St. Paul's parishioners. More details will be coming soon about that tour.
