My Dear Friends in Christ,

I pray that you are relishing the beauty of God's creation, which is especially glorious in the Upstate in the months of April and May. As we have observed the season of Lent, the solemnities of Holy Week, and the joy of Easter, I have been overwhelmed with gratitude for ministries of so many of you in this parish! Our worship services have been rich and meaningful, thanks to the tireless efforts of so many members of our Altar Guild, our choirs, and our liturgical ministers. Our children and youth are being taught the basics of our faith by caring and loving adults (although more volunteers are needed to provide consistent teaching). Fellowship and Parish Life have brought us together to break bread and play together, surefire ways to build up the community of faith we call Holy Trinity Episcopal Parish.

Our Pastoral Care Team has once again delivered goody bags as tokens of love to those who can't join us in person, or who might just need a reminder that they have a church family who loves them in a time of difficulty. The PC Team has also provided meals, cards, and prayer shawls in the same spirit. Our Mary Moxley Laib Chapter of the Daughters of the King maintains a confidential prayer list, praying daily individually and meeting weekly to pray in community for the concerns that are brought to our attention. Now that flowers adorn the altar again, the DoK will resume their ministry of flower deliveries each week.

We continue to see significant numbers of University students in church each week. Canterbury of Clemson is small in numbers, but mighty in spirit and faithfulness. This is the most active group of students I have witnessed in my time here, gathering for fellowship and faith formation, getting together for Bible studies on campus, as well as jumping to help out as needed. We have Canterbury students serving at the altar, helping with Sunday school, and even providing parking assistance for a recent funeral.

The Episcopal Day School is flourishing, and the bonds between school and church are very strong. We regularly see EDS families joining us for worship. Our parish hall walls are adorned with delightful works of art created by our EDS students. Our EDS board works hard to provide support and guidance for the Director and

Teachers and has been actively engaged in helping EDS regain its financial and institutional health after the challenges of the past 4 years.

Our Stewardship and Financial Committees work hard to help the Vestry fulfill their obligations to fund the ministries and programs of our parish, as well as maintaining our properties. The St. Paul's Committee plans for the upkeep and continued use of our beloved Mother Church in Pendleton. The Vestry not only takes care of the practical concerns of the parish, they work to set the mission and vision for Holy Trinity, with your input and the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

As you can see, this little parish provides levels of ministry well beyond most congregations of this size. It is this spirit of giving and doing that makes Holy Trinity so special and such an integral part of our community. The thing is—it takes every member of the church answering the call to ministry to make it happen. Every one is called to active ministry in the church by the promises of our baptismal life. Some minister by being parents and bringing their children to church. Some minister by being cooks and feeding people at church and in homeless shelters. Some minister by being servants in our liturgies. Some minister by being handy with garden and building tools. Some minister by praying. Some minister by making things that are beautiful and useful. Some minister by being welcoming. Some minister by giving financially to support the work of the church. All minister by recognizing and offering the gifts they have been given by our living, loving God. For all these and so many more ministers of the Good News, I give thanks and praise to God!

The Assistant Rector Fund has \$61,232.87 as of 02/29/2024. Ellen Haase and her Committee of Jan Cribb, Jim Reed, Bob Taylor, Bill Purkerson, and Charlie Curtis continue to work toward building the fund and the job search. I ask that you continue to pray that God will bless our efforts to find the Assistant Rector who will bless Holy Trinity and be blessed by Holy Trinity.

Finally, I ask that you prayerfully consider your role as a parishioner of Holy Trinity. Our church is not our beautiful buildings and grounds in Clemson and Pendleton but all of us members and supporters of the Parish. We need your participation as volunteers. March 2024 Tempo Financial Report Bob Taylor, Treasurer

Two months into Holy Trinity's 2024 Financial year, things appear to be slightly behind schedule with respect to both actual income and expenses and budgeted income and expenses.


^{*} **Special Note**: Budgeted Year to Date Expenses less than Budgeted Year to Date Expenses reflects salary adjustments not going into effect until February 1st following the Vestry's official approval of the 2024 Statement of Mission in January 2024.

No large unexpected expenditures during the first two months of 2024 contribute to the expenses to date being almost \$4,500 less than budget. The usual lag in pledge income at the start of a calendar year is again reflected in income to date being almost \$7,000 less than budget. Expenses through the first two months of 2024 are slightly above (\$753.72) income to date. Generous parishioners' gifts for principal-only payment have significantly lowered Holy Trinity's only indebtedness, and a larger portion of the required monthly payment of \$8,983.77 (from Trinity Place funds) continues to reduce the loan balance further.

Seasonal Notes:

Eastertide, Ascension, and Pentecost

"But now the power of Easter has burst upon us with the resurrection of Christ. Now we find in ourselves a strength which is not our own, and which is freely given to us whenever we need it, raising us above the Law, giving us a new law which is hidden in Christ: the law of His merciful love for us. Now we no longer strive to be good because we have to, because it is a duty, but because our joy is to please Him who has given all His love to us! Now our life is full of meaning!" –Thomas Merton, Seasons of Celebration

Eastertide is a 50 day season of celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord, which has set us free to become the people of Christ's Body we were made to be. Our worship services will be filled with acclamations of the joy of this season, and our Scripture readings will be focused on discovering again the wonders of the new life that has been given to us. Readings from the Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel of John will help us to relive the astonishing awakening of the early church to the meaning of the Resurrection. The liturgical color is white.

The Feast of the Ascension occurs 40 days after Easter, celebrating the return of the Son to the heavenly realm to prepare for the sending of the Holy Spirit as the first gift of God to the Church. (See Mark 16:19, Luke 24:51, and Acts 1:2.) The theological significance of the Ascension is that Jesus returned there in his eternal, human body—not as a purely spiritual being—establishing the fullness of humanity in himself. In the mystery of the Ascension, Christ brings human nature to the divine Kingdom. This is the foundation of our hope of the general Resurrection of all who believe and put their trust in the salvation of Christ. We will celebrate the Ascension of Christ on Thursday, May 9, with a Holy Eucharist at 12:30 in the Nave.

The Feast of Pentecost is the celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles, creating the community of the New Covenant, also known as the Church, the Body of Christ. "Pentecost" means 50th day, and it is a Jewish festival of the harvest and the giving of Torah to the Israelites in the wilderness. It was on this festival day that the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles, Mary, and other followers of Jesus in Jerusalem (Acts 2). The Holy Spirit bestowed the gift of preaching and sent the followers of Jesus out into the world to obey the final instruction of Jesus to go forth making disciples and teaching the Gospel of peace, hope, and salvation in his name. We celebrate this feast with joy on May 19 this year. We will celebrate the Holy Eucharist at 8:00 at Holy Trinity, and at 10:30 at St. Paul's, with a picnic following in the churchyard. The liturgical color is red, for the Holy Spirit, and all are encouraged to wear red on that day.

Refugee Support Report

We have now been partnering with Lutheran Services Carolinas for almost three years. Several parishioners of Holy Trinity joined Circles of Welcome to provide support for families fleeing from

Afghanistan after the withdrawal of

US troops in 2020. Since then, many of those families have moved on to other parts of the country where there are significant communities of Afghans and Afghan-Americans. More recently, LSC has welcomed refugee families from Ukraine, various areas



of Africa experiencing intense conflict, and several new families from Afghanistan. Holy Trinity has hosted ESOL classes for the women and children of refugee families for the past two summers and hopes to do so again this year.



LSC is partnering with Open Arms Refugee Ministry to provide a day of orientation to the cultural and civic practices of the United States, South Carolina, and Clemson. As you might imagine, in many cases the adjustments to the differences these families experience when they arrive are quite significant. We are happy to host this event at Holy Trinity this month on April 20th. Please note that if you are planning to

park at Holy Trinity for the Clemson Music Festival that day, the upper parking lot will be reserved for this event from 9:00 am – 5:00 pm.

There will be opportunities to become directly involved in future Circles of Welcome and in providing hospitality for future classes and gatherings to support the refugee families who continue to be resettled here in our community. Please prayerfully consider how you respond to our Lord's call to welcome, feed, and take care of our new neighbors.

The vitality of this church depends on the growth of our families and children and I am relying on our entire parish to help me continue towards this upward growth.






